CSG's Peer Support Services takes an active, hands-on approach to working with individuals and assisting them in the mental health recovery process. A key part of this program is the Certified Peer Specialist, who works closely with each individual to help him or her reach the goals that are set.

Certified Peer Specialists are, or have been, recipients of mental health services in the community. Their experiences give them a special understanding of the recovery process.

Certified Peer Specialists receive specialized training that allows them to:

- assist individuals in basic living skills, support and advocacy
- develop social networks and natural supports
- link individuals to other services

CSG services are provided in a nondiscriminatory manner, without regard to race, sex, color, national origin, ancestry, religious creed, disability, age or Limited English Proficiency (LEP).

Our Services

Peer Support Services assists individuals with mental health issues by developing their path to recovery. Individuals will work with Certified Peer Specialists in a variety of areas, including education, independent living and relationship building.

Individuals have the opportunity to identify and choose for themselves the role they want in the community. Peer Support Services helps individuals achieve their desired roles such as where they want to live, learn, work and engage in social activities.

Individuals may choose to work toward many different goals, including securing a job, obtaining a GED or going to college, living independently, or working to overcome obstacles that keep them from maintaining relationships.
